PROPOSED CONSTITUTION CHANGES

3. DEFINITIONS.

- In the Definition "ACT (The)", add after the words "No. 20 of 2012 " the following "and as amended from time to time"
- Rationale: Any changes (amendments) to the Act would take effect at any rate, but by having these words written in it would save any problem later on. (As well as the above, it will be necessary to include the proposed words in Cl's 5.1; 11.3.9; 11.3.10 and 20.5).
- **NEW DEFINITION** "Approved Vehicle", "An approved registered towable or self-powered vehicle designed to provide accommodation and facilities for sleeping, dining and the preparation of food."

Rationale: By including this term in the Definitions area and bringing all related clauses into line it should make any future amendments easier to adopt.

4. MEMBERSHIP

• **DELETE** all of 4.1.2 and **replace** with new "4.1.2 An owner or user of an Approved vehicle, and "

Rationale: This change allows flexibility in any clauses that refer to vehicles which may need to be changed in the future.

• **DELETE** the heading 4.2, and **replace** with new 4.2 "The Club Secretary shall cause to be maintained a Register of all members which shall show, but not be limited to"

Rationale: This allows the Secretary control of membership registration requirements but for someone else to do the actual recording.

5. RIGHTS and RESPONSIBILITIES of MEMBERS

• **ADD** in Cl. 5.1 in third line after words Reform Act 2012, the words "and as amended from time to time".

8. MANAGEMENT of CLUB.

• **DELETE** Cl. 8.5.4 and **REPLACE** with new Cl, 8.5.4 "shall meet as deemed necessary by the Office Bearers in conjunction provided that no less than four ordinary meetings of the Executive are held annually"

Rationale: There are times that either due to absence of two or more Office Bearers, or even a lack of business, important in itself, but all of which could just as easily be held over and save calling every member of Exec to a meeting.

9. DIVISIONAL COMMITTEE.

• **Delete** SUB-CLAUSE 9.2.5

Rationale: The duties and function of the Marshal have materially changed over the years, plus the fact that it is often difficult to elect members of the Division to fill the offices. This deletion will make it slightly less difficult to fill Divisional committees.

10 ACTIVITIES CO-ORDINATOR.

• **DELETE** words "shall meet with" in Sub-clause Cl. 10.1.3 and **REPLACE** with new words "shall liaise with Divisional Marshals"

Rationale: This still allows the Activities Co-ordinator to obtain feed back from Marshals to determine suitability of Parks or other venues.

11. DUTIES of OFFICERS.

- **ADD** in Cl. 11.3.9 after the words Reform Act 2012, the words "and as amended from time to time"
- **ADD** In Cl. 11.3.10 after the words Reform Act 2012, the words "and as amended from time to time"

Rationale: Brings into conformity with previous clauses.

PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGES

2 RALLY ATTENDANCE CREDITS.

- In Sub-clause 2.1.1 replace words a Caravan with "an approved vehicle"
- In Sub-clause 2.1.2 replace the words a Caravan with "an approved vehicle"
- In Sub-clause 2.1.3 replace the words a Caravan with "an approved vehicle"
- **In sub-clause 2.1.5** In the phrase "a caravan" replace the word Caravan with "an approved vehicle".
- In line two of the Sub-clause replace the words 'Caravan' with the words "approved vehicle" and add after the words "shall be towed" the words "or driven"
- In line four of the sub-clause replace the word Caravan with the words "approved vehicle" *Rationale:* Consistency of expression.
- In sub-clause 2.2 replace the words "a Caravan" with the words "an approved vehicle" *Rationale:* Consistency of expression.
- 7. SORRENTO SITE ALLOCATION.

Renumber clause as 6 and subsequent sub-clauses appropriately.

• In Sub-clause 7.3.1.2 (6.3.1.2) replace the word Caravan with the words "an approved vehicle"

Rationale: Consistency of expression.

8. FILM SOCIETY.

Re-number all of Clause 8 and sub-clauses Film Society with 7 and sub-clauses appropriately.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

Under Clause 13.2.2, the President and Secretary call a Special General Meeting of the Club to be held at the Annual General Meeting on Sunday 18th November 2018.

The purpose of the Special General Meeting is to vote on the following two-part motion. Should the first motion fail then the second is withdrawn.

- 1. That the land at Learmonth owned by the RACV Caravan Club of Vic Inc be sold for the purpose of part 2 of this two-part motion.
- 2. That the proceeds from the sale be used to purchase a Club facility for a meeting place and storage of Club equipment and records.


